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I have suffered from epilepsy since I was 14 and first suffered with Grand Mal seizures when I hit my head in a diving accident in a swimming pool. I am now 57.

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I attend the National Hospital for Neurology in London and saw various neurologists. I have had EEGs and MRIs and taken 8 various tablets 1, 2, or 3 at a time but never found the correct ones.

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I am taking 200mg of lacosamide 300mg in the morning and 600mg of Oxcarbazepine in the evening also 300mg of Pregabalin twice a day. My tonic-clonic seizures have now lowered from two or three to 1 or 2 nocturnal seizures a month.

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I have a fabulous wife who understands my epilepsy and a great neurologist now. I am not ashamed or embarrassed about my epilepsy and live a normal life.

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
